SENIOR ONE-DESIGN NOTICE OF REGATTA

1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the *rules* as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing 2005-2008*
- 1.2 Part 5 Section B is changed to provide for arbitration of protests of Part 2 rules.

2 CLASSES

The regatta is open to the following one-design classes: Etchells, IODs, Shields, S-Boats and Stars. To qualify as a class for this regatta, 3 valid entries must be received for that class prior to 1200 Friday, October 5, 2007.

3 ENTRIES & FEES

- 3.1 All eligible boats may enter by going to <https://app1.regatta-manager.com/larchmont/Columbus Day 07> and registering on line or by registering on the approved entry form received by Larchmont Yacht Club not later than 1700 Friday, October 5, 2007.
- 3.2 The entry fee for this regatta is \$50.00.

4 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The 2007 YRALIS Mid-Sound One-Design Sailing Instructions will apply. Amendments, if any, to these instructions will be posted on the official notice board, located on the front porch of the Larchmont Yacht Club, at least two hours before the first warning on the day they take effect and on the above website.

5 COURSES AND RACES

- 5.1 The warning signal for the first division will be at **1225** each day.
- 5.2 Courses will be as described in the 2007 YRALIS Mid-Sound Sailing Instructions.
- 5.3 The race committee intends to run multiple races each day

6 RACE AREA

The racing area will be in the waters off the breakwater of Larchmont Harbor.

7 SCORING

- 7.1 One completed race constitutes a series.
- 7.2 If fewer than five races are completed a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
- 7.3 If five or more races are completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score subject to rule 89.3 (b).
- 7.4 Boats failing to finish within the time limit will be scored Time Limit Expired (TLE) and will be given two (2) points more than the number of finishers, except that she shall not be scored worse than DNF. This changes rule 35.

8 PRIZES

Series prizes will be awarded following the conclusion of racing on Sunday, Oct. 7 on the front lawn of the Larchmont Yacht Club.

Series prizes will be awarded for classes that qualify under section 2.

First place for all classes with three or more competitors.

Second place for all classes with four or more competitors.

Third place for classes with five or more competitors.

9 GUEST MOORINGS, USE OF HOISTS AND PRIVILEGES

Guest moorings will be available on a first come basis. Please contact the Waterfront Director, Captain Dave Sandoval, at the Larchmont Yacht Club for reservations. 914-468-7742 or marinefacilities@larchmontyc.org. The Club's hoists will be available for launching and taking out visiting boats. Dry sailed boats may be parked at the owners' risk on trailers in the boat yard from Oct 7 to Oct 9.

10 CONDUCT AND RESPONSIBILITY

10.1 The skipper/owner shall be responsible for all actions of his or her crew or guests. In the event of a breach of conduct, sportsmanship, destruction of property, or failure to comply with the request of any race officer, committee member or agent of the Larchmont Yacht Club, the skipper/owner will be held responsible and his/her boat shall be subject to protest and disqualification.

10.2 The Larchmont Yacht Club is not responsible and will not accept any liability for bodily injury, death or property damage suffered from any cause. Each participant, including skipper and crew, participates in the regatta entirely at his/her own risk and waives any and all claims, including those arising from negligence or lack of due care, which he/she may have against the Larchmont Yacht Club, its regatta committee, and its officers, trustees, committee members, members, agents, or employees. Responsibility for evaluating the wind, sea and weather conditions rests with each participant as does responsibility for the safe condition of the boat, including safety equipment and rigging and for deciding when to wear life jackets. Patrol boats or other assistance will not likely be available. Assistance, if any, from the regatta committee or other Larchmont Yacht Club vessels, or other patrol boats, from any personnel manning them, is entirely at the risk of the participant.
