NOTICE OF REGATTA

1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed in the *rules* as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing 2009-2012*, the current IRC Rules, the current PHRF Regulations as administered by the YRA of LIS and Level or One-Design Class rules
- 1.2 Boats shall observe the Minimum Equipment Recommendations of YRA of LIS, Race Category C.
- 1.3 Each boat shall carry a radio capable of transmitting and receiving on VHF channel 73.
- 1.4 Part 5, Section B is changed to provide for arbitration of protests of Part 2 rules.

2 ENTRIES

- 2.1 Eligible boats may enter by registering on approved entry forms received by the Larchmont Yacht Club front desk not later than 1700, Wednesday, July 8, 2009 **OR** online at: www.larchmontyc.org
- 2.2 The Entry Fee is \$100.00.
- 2.3 There will be IRC, Level, One Design and PHRF divisions. At the discretion of the race committee separate divisions for Level and One-Design may be assigned. Divisions may be subdivided into classes.
- 2.3(a) For those classes not sailing Level or One Design, entries must be accompanied by a valid PHRF or IRC rating certificate. PHRF certificates from other areas will be adjusted to conform to the YRA of LIS. IRC certificates do not need to be endorsed.

3 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 3.1 Sailing Instructions will be available at least one week before the regatta on the internet at www.larchmontyc.org and at the Larchmont Yacht Club front desk or the Hospitality Desk on the day of the event. Sailing instructions may also be available on the first day of racing prior to the first warning signal of the day from the committee boat.
- 3.2 Scratch Sheets will be available at the front desk after 1800 Friday, July 10, at the Hospitality Desk during the event and, and from the committee boat prior to the first warning signal of the day or on line at Regatta Manager.

4 COURSES, RACING AREA AND RACES

- 4.1 The racing area will be south of Milton Point.
- 4.2 The courses will be as described in the Sailing Instructions.
- 4.3 The warning for the first division will be at 1055 each day.

5 SCORING

- 5.1 One completed race constitutes a series.

- 5.2 If fewer than five races are completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores. If five or more races are completed a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score subject to rule 90.3 (b).
- 5.3 For PHRF time allowances will be computed using Time on Distance.
For IRC the boats rating allowance will be applied as a factor of the elapsed time.

6 PRIZES

Series prizes for First, Second and Third places in each division will be awarded on Sunday, July 19 after racing on the front lawn of the Larchmont Yacht Club.

7 GUEST MOORINGS AND CLUB PRIVILEGES

- 7.1 Guest moorings will be available on a first come basis. Please contact the Waterfront Director, Lincoln White, at 914-468-7742 or email moorings@larchmontyc.org for reservations.
- 7.2 The privileges of the Club for Race Week will be extended to owners and crews.

8 CONDUCT AND RESPONSIBILITY

- 8.1 The skipper/owner shall be responsible for all actions of his or her crew or guests. In the event of a breach of conduct, sportsmanship, destruction of property, or failure to comply with the request of any race officer, committee member or agent of the Larchmont Yacht Club, the skipper/owner will be held responsible and his/her boat shall be subject to protest and disqualification.
- 8.2 The Larchmont Yacht Club is not responsible and will not accept any liability for bodily injury, death or property damage suffered from any cause. Each participant, including skipper and crew, participates in the regatta entirely at his/her own risk and waives any and all claims, including those arising from negligence or lack of due care, which he/she may have against the Larchmont Yacht Club, its regatta committee, and its officers, trustees, committee members, members, agents, or employees. Responsibility for evaluating the wind, sea and weather conditions rests with each participant as does responsibility for the safe condition of the boat, including safety equipment and rigging and for deciding when to wear life jackets. Patrol boats or other assistance will not likely be available. Assistance, if any, from the regatta committee or other Larchmont Yacht Club vessels, or other patrol boats, from any personnel manning them, is entirely at the risk of the participant.
