NOTICE OF RACE

1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the *rules* as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing 2009-2012*.
- 1.2 Part 5, Section B is changed to provide for arbitration of protests of Part 2 rules.

2 CLASSES

- 2.1 The regatta is open to the following one-design classes: Etchells, I.O.D, Shields, Sonar, S Boats, RK6s and 505s. To qualify as a class for this regatta, 3 valid entries must be received for that class prior to 1800, Wednesday, July 8.
- 2.2 A class may elect to race on one weekend instead of the two that are scheduled. On days when a class elects not to race, boats in that class will not get a start, nor will they be scored, provided that the race committee has been previously informed of such class decision.

3 ENTRIES

- 3.1 Eligible boats may enter by registering on approved entry forms received at the Larchmont Yacht Club front desk not later than 1200 Friday, July, 10, 2009 OR online at: www.larchmontyc.org
- 3.2 The entry fee is \$100.00 per boat. For classes electing to race one weekend the entry fee is \$60.00.
- 3.3 All entries not submitted on line, shall be mailed to the Larchmont Yacht Club, 1 Woodbine Ave., Larchmont, NY 10538. Telephone: 914-834-2440. Faxed entries will be accepted only with a valid signature for credit card authorization. Fax: 914-468-7751. All entries must be signed by the owner or master. Credit card authorizations must be legible and signed by the card holder.

4 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The 2009 YRALIS Mid-Sound One-Design Sailing Instructions will apply. Amendments, if any, to these sailing instructions will be available at the front desk of the Larchmont Yacht Club no later than Saturday, July 4th or on the website at: www.larchmontyc.org.

5 COURSES AND RACES

- 5.1 The first warning signal will be at **1225** each day.
- 5.2 The courses will be as described in the 2009 Mid-Sound Sailing Instructions.
- 5.3 The race committee intends to run multiple races each day.

6 SCORING

- 6.1 The Low-Point Scoring System of App. A2 will apply. One completed race constitutes a series.
- 6.2 If fewer than five races are completed a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores. If five or more races are completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score subject to rule 90.3 (b).

7 PRIZES

- 7.1 Series prizes will be awarded on Sunday, July 19, after racing, on the front lawn of the Larchmont Yacht Club.
- 7.2 Series prizes will be awarded for classes that qualify under section 2.
First place for all classes with three or more competitors.
Second place for all classes with four or more competitors.
Third place for classes with five or more competitors.

8 GUEST MOORINGS, USE OF HOISTS AND PRIVILEGES

- 8.1 Guest moorings will be available on a first come basis. Please contact the Waterfront Director, Lincoln White or email moorings@larchmontyc.org
- 8.2 The Club's hoists will be available for launching and taking out visiting boats. Dry sailed boats may be parked at the owners' risk on trailers in the boat yard from July 9 to July 20. Please contact the Waterfront Director at the Larchmont Yacht Club for reservations and hoist use.
- 8.3 The privileges of the Club for Race Week will be extended to owners and crews.

9 CONDUCT AND RESPONSIBILITY

- 9.1 The skipper/owner shall be responsible for all actions of his or her crew or guests. In the event of a breach of conduct, sportsmanship, destruction of property, or failure to comply with the request of any race officer, committee member or agent of the Larchmont Yacht Club, the skipper/owner will be held responsible and his/her boat shall be subject to protest and disqualification.
- 9.2 The Larchmont Yacht Club is not responsible and will not accept any liability for bodily injury, death or property damage suffered from any cause. Each participant, including skipper and crew, participates in the regatta entirely at his/her own risk and waives any and all claims, including those arising from negligence or lack of due care, which he/she may have against the Larchmont Yacht Club, its regatta committee, and its officers, trustees, committee members, members, agents, or employees. Responsibility for evaluating the wind, sea and weather conditions rests with each participant as does responsibility for the safe condition of the boat, including safety equipment and rigging and for deciding when to wear life jackets. Patrol boats or other assistance will not likely be available. Assistance, if any, from the regatta committee or other Larchmont Yacht Club vessels, or other patrol boats, from any personnel manning them, is entirely at the risk of the participant.
